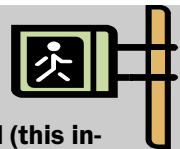

**Ministry Spotlight** *This month's ministry spotlight focuses on three mission's teams that are in need of individuals to serve as Team Captains.*

**Good Neighbor Ministry Team** - The goal of the Good Neighbor Team is to build community relations and goodwill. This team is active every Saturday morning at the Alston-Massenburg Center in the Northeastern Quadrant of Wake Forest to serve area residents a simple meal. The Team Captain for this team organizes, schedules, and follows up with volunteers. This person is also responsible for purchasing supplies for the ministry (funds are provided from the Missions Council budget). This is a weekly commitment and requires excellent organization, and people management skills.. A new Team Captain is needed in this position starting July 1st, but would be a good idea for this person to begin training soon.

**Mission Quake Team** - Missions Quake is an annual community event organized by local churches and organizations. The goal of Mission Quake is to break down walls that separate the community denominationally, racially, economically, etc. in order to work together for the alleviation of human suffering and to promote the common good. The event is held in late September. The Team Captain for this team works in conjunction with the Community Mission Quake Committee to organize, and facilitate the events of Mission Quake Weekend. This commitment requires excellent organization and administrative skills. Monthly meetings being in July and are held weekly in the last few weeks prior to the event. There is a great amount of e-mail communication between team members.

**Missions Education Team** - Team Captain for this team organizes educational opportunities that provide missions education for children, youth, and adults. This person works with missions leaders and oversees the weekly operation of the pre-school, children, and youth activities on Wednesday evenings. This is a weekly commitment. A Team Captain is needed to start mid summer to help plan programming that will begin in September, but it would be a good idea for this person to be identified at this point so they can observe current programming.
